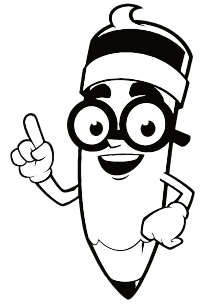


Basic Strokes



Trace the stroke lines & practice
